Course Description

Studio Art gives students the opportunity to create, critique, and breakdown art and design in a variety of ways. They will learn to use a variety of two-dimensional materials and techniques, and study a selection of different artists, art periods, and contemporary forms of art/design. A strong focus in Studio in Art will be the usage and identification of the elements and principles of design.

What to Expect

Besides creating artwork, students will participate in the following:

- Learning new vocabulary words
- Class discussions
- Art critiques (discussion & written)
- Expanding knowledge of art through assigned readings
- Being able to not only produce art but also research, talk, and write about art/artists.

Class Rules and Expectations

An individual of high school age should be aware of what constitutes as socially acceptable behavior along with the responsibilities and consequences that accompany such behavior.

<u>In this art room students are expected to:</u>

- Be Respectful:
- Use appropriate language.
- Raise your hand if you have a question or comment.

- If the teacher is talking, you should not be talking.
- Be Responsible:
- Come prepared to class. Be ready to work.
- Clean up and return all supplies before leaving class.
- All students must sit in their assigned seats.
- Play fighting is unacceptable and will not be tolerated.
- Inappropriate use or theft of art supplies is unacceptable and will not be tolerated.
- Bullying is not acceptable and will not be tolerated.

Failure to abide by these conditions will affect the daily grade and/or may result in disciplinary action.

Late Policy:

It is important that students are on time to every class. If you arrive after the late bell, please get a late pass before entering the room.

Attendance Policy:

- Hand drawings
- Still life drawings
