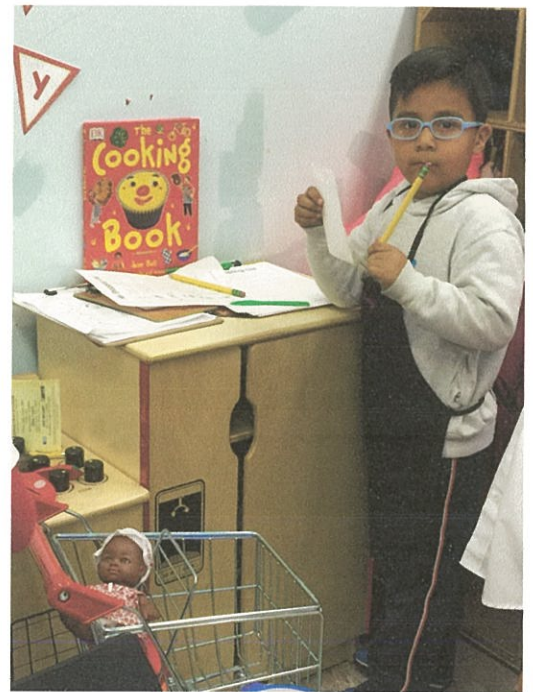
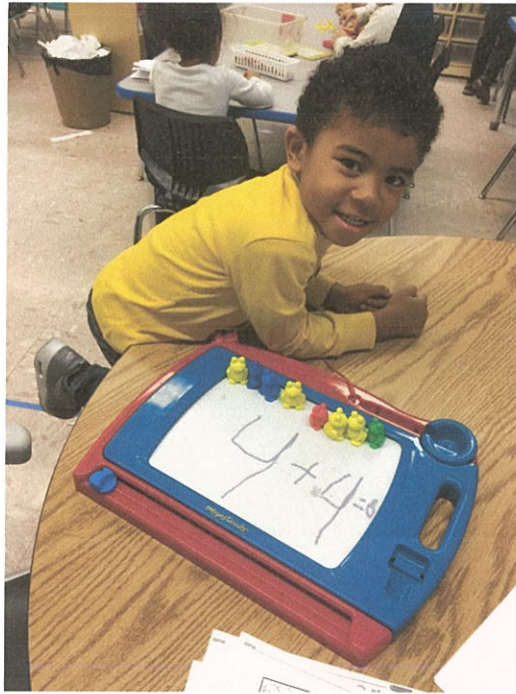


TEAM PRE K -K !!

100th Day & Read Across America

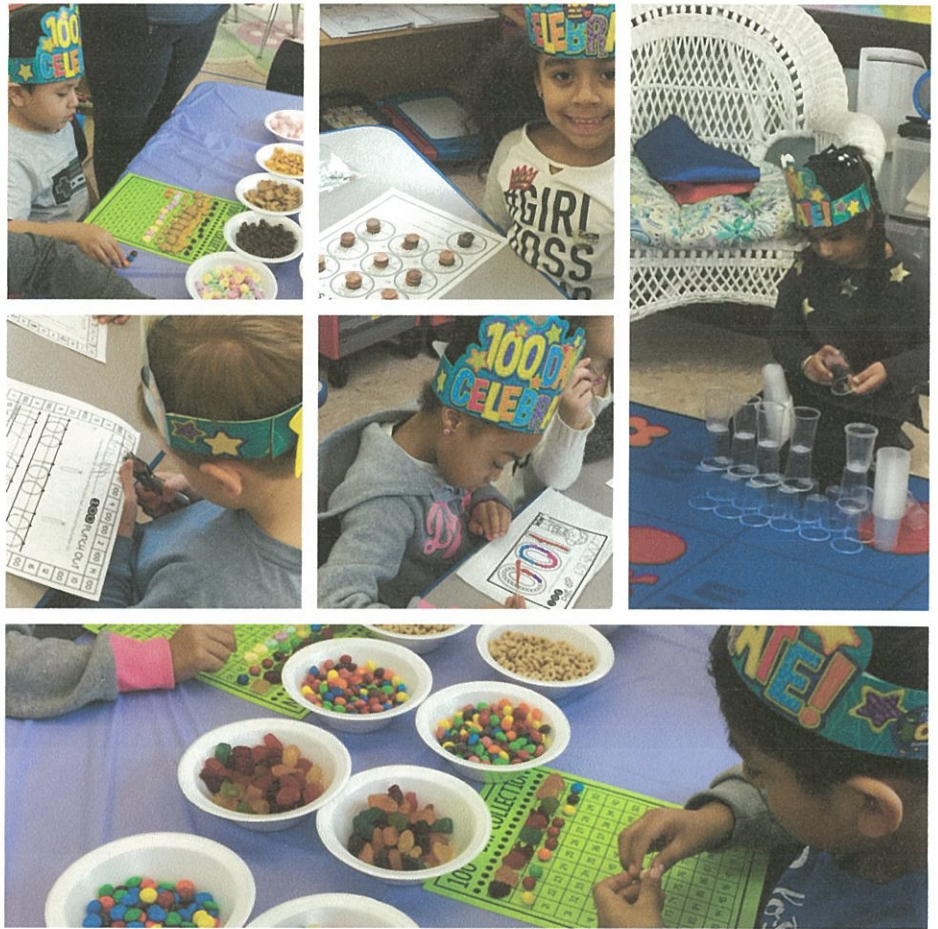
100 Days Smarter!

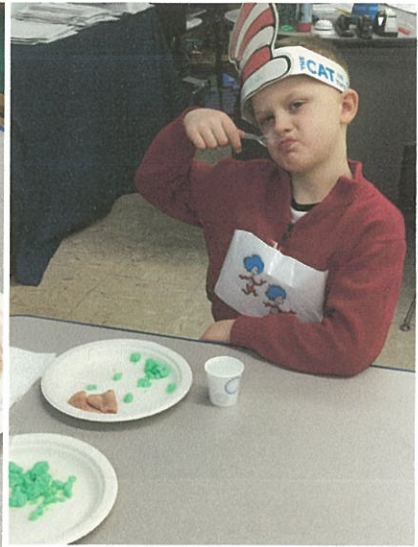
