- Inpatient Rehab Programs in Westchester County are for adults 18 years and older. This level of
 care provides intensive evaluation and treatment that includes individual and group counseling,
 and rehabilitation services. The program is medically supervised 24 hours a day, seven days a
 week. Generally this program keeps clients in treatment for 14 to 28 days. Recommendations are
 made for the appropriate level of care prior to discharge.
