GEORGE SPECK-CRUM INVENTOR

• THE POTATO CHIP WAS INVENTED IN 1853, BY AN AFRICAN AMERICAN CHEF NAMED GEORGE SPECK-CRUM. GEORGE CREATED THE POTATO CHIP AFTER A CUSTOMER COMPLAINED THAT THE FRENCH-FRIES HE COOKED WERE TOO THICK.



GEORGE WASHINGTON CARVER INVENTOR

GEORGE WASHINGTON CARVER WAS AN INVENTOR AND SCIENTIST, WHO IN 1896 INVENTED PEANUT BUTTER

JOHN LEE LOVE INVENTOR

• 1897, JOHN LEE LOVE PATENTED A PORTABLE PENCIL SHARPENER KNOWN AS THE "LOVE SHARPENER." LEE DIED IN A CAR AND TRAIN COLLISION IN NORTH CAROLINA ON DECEMBER 26, 1931.



HENRY T. SAMPSON INVENTOR



If it wasn't for Dr. Henry T. Sampson we wouldn't have cell phone technology today. On July 6, 1971 he was awarded a patent for a gammaelectrical cell device that produced a high voltage of energy from a radiation source, and could detect incoming signals. He is also the first African American to earn a Ph.D. in Nuclear Engineering in the United States.



Philip Emeagwali "Father of the internet" invented a formula that spawned the Internet.




GARRET MORGAN INVENTOR

GARRETT AUGUSTUS MORGAN (MARCH 4, 1877 -AUGUST 27, 1963), WAS AN AFRICAN-AMERICAN INVENTOR AND BUSINESSMAN. HE WAS THE FIRST PERSON TO PATENT A TRAFFIC SIGNAL. HE ALSO DEVELOPED THE GAS MASK (AND MANY OTHER INVENTIONS). MORGAN USED HIS GAS MASK (PATENT NO. 1,090,936, 1914) TO RESCUE MINERS WHO WERE TRAPPED UNDERGROUND IN A NOXIOUS MINE. SOON AFTER, MORGAN WAS ASKED TO PRODUCE GAS MASKS FOR THE US ARMY.




PHILIP B DOWNING INVENTOR







LONNIE B. JOHNSON INVENTOR



Lonnie B Johnson inventor of Super Soaker water gun. In 1982, Lonnie was he conducted an experiment at home on a heat pump that used water instead of Freon. This experimentation, which resulted in Johnson shooting a stream of water across his bathroom into the tub, led directly to the development of the Power Drencher, the precursor to the Super Soaker.
