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Launching Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s Poem & Essay Contest



AFRICAN AMERICANS AND LABOR

Poem Entry (Grades 1-4)

Write a poem about how Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. helped people. Think about his work for fairness, kindness, and making the world a better place. Your poem should be between 10 to 20 lines.

Poem Entry (Grades 5-8)

Write a poem about how Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. worked to ensure fair treatment and economic justice for workers. Think about his efforts to support labor rights and equality. Your poem should be between 15 to 30 lines. Make sure it's detailed yet engaging.

Essay Entry (Grades 9-12)

Write an essay that explores the evolution of labor among African Americans from slavery to the present day. Discuss changes in roles and opportunities, the impact on communities and society, and highlight significant contributions by African American professionals. Reflect on Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s legacy in championing labor dignity and economic justice. Essays should be between 800-1,200 words. Ensure your essay is comprehensive yet concise.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Format:

- Use a clear, readable font such as Times New Roman or Arial, size 12.
- Double-space your poem/essay.
- Include a title at the top of your poem/essay.

Originality: Make sure your poem/essay is your own work. Plagiarism will result in disqualification.

Language: Use words that are kind and respectful.

Poems and essay submissions are due **Friday, February 14, 2025** and may be emailed to contest@yonkersny.gov or sent by mail to **Mayor's Office (Attention: Dwanita Crosby), Yonkers City Hall, 2nd Floor, 40 South Broadway, Yonkers, NY 10701**. Winners will be selected by the Mayor's African American Advisory Board and will be notified on **Friday, February 21st**. For questions regarding the poem/essay contest email Dwanita Crosby at dwanita.crosby@yonkersny.gov. Mayor Spano will select one poem from grades 1-4, one poem from grades 5-8 and one essay from grades 9-12. The winning poems and essay will be displayed at Yonkers City Hall and online for Yonkers residents to enjoy. Winners will be presented a certificate from Mayor Spano and will be asked to present their work at the **City's Annual Black History Month Celebration at Yonkers City Hall on Friday, February 28, 2025 at 6:00 pm**.

ATTENTION PARENTS/GUARDIANS FLU SEASON

DON'T SEND YOUR CHILDREN TO SCHOOL WHEN THEY ARE SICK!

A child who is sick will not be able to perform well in school and is likely to spread the illness to other children and staff. We suggest making a plan for childcare ahead of time to prepare for a comforting place if your child is ill.

DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL IF HE OR SHE HAS:

- FEVER IN THE PAST 24 HOURS
- VOMITING IN THE PAST 24 HOURS
- DIARRHEA IN THE PAST 24 HOURS
- CHILLS
- SORE THROAT
- STREP THROAT - THE CHILD MUST HAVE BEEN TAKING AN ANTIBIOTIC FOR AT LEAST 24 HOURS BEFORE RETURNING TO SCHOOL
- EARACHE
- PERSISTENT HEADACHE
- BAD COLD, WITH A VERY RUNNY NOSE OR BAD COUGH, ESPECIALLY IF IT HAS KEPT THE CHILD AWAKE AT NIGHT
- DRAINAGE FROM EYES WITH CRUSTING ON EYELIDS

If your child becomes ill at school and the school nurse feels the child is too sick to benefit from school or is contagious to other children and staff, you will be called to come and take the child home from school. It is essential that your child's school has up to date phone numbers where you can be contacted during the day and emergency numbers in the event you cannot be reached. Please be sure that arrangements can be made to transport your child home from school and that childcare is available in case of illness. If your daytime or emergency phone number changes during the year, please immediately notify your child's school.

If your child is absent for 3 or more days, medical justification is required for return to school. Please call your child's school Health Office if you have any questions or concerns or call the Medical and Nursing Services at 914-376-8226.

Si su hijo se enferma en la escuela y la enfermera de la escuela considera que el niño está demasiado enfermo para beneficiarse de la escuela o es contagioso para otros niños y el personal, se le llamará para que venga y lleve al niño a casa desde la escuela. Es esencial que la escuela de su hijo tenga números de teléfono actualizados donde se le pueda contactar durante el día y números de emergencia en caso de que no se pueda localizarlo. Por favor, asegúrese de que se pueda organizar el transporte de su hijo a casa desde la escuela y de que hay guardería disponible en caso de enfermedad. Si su número de teléfono durante el día o de emergencia cambia durante el año, notifique de inmediato a la escuela de su hijo.

Si su hijo está ausente durante 3 o más días, se requiere una justificación médica para regresar a la escuela. Llame a la Oficina de Salud de la escuela de su hijo si tiene alguna pregunta o inquietud o llame al Servicios médicos y de enfermería al 914-376-8226.








