


Apollo 11 was the spaceflight that landed the first two people on the Moon. Commander Neil Armstrong and lunar module pilot Buzz Aldrin, both American, landed the Apollo Lunar Module *Eagle* on July 20, 1969, at
20:17 UTC. Armstrong became the first person to step onto the lunar surface; Aldrin joined him 19 minutes later. In this iconic **photograph** Buzz Aldrin salutes the U.S flag on the Moon (mission time: 110:10:33). His fingertips are visible on the far side of his faceplate. Note the well-defined footprints in the foreground. Buzz is facing up towards the Sun.







Raising the Flag on Iwo Jima is an iconic photograph taken by Joe Rosenthal on February 23, 1945, which depicts six United States Marines raising a U.S. flag atop Mount Suribachi, during the Battle of Iwo Jima, in World War II. The **photograph** was first published in Sunday newspapers on February 25, 1945.





The Thinker is a bronze sculpture by Auguste Rodin. The work shows a nude male figure of over life-size sitting on a rock with his chin resting on one hand as though deep in thought, often used as an image to represent philosophy. *The Thinker* was initially named *The Poet*, and was part of a large commission begun in 1880 for a doorway surround called *The Gates of Hell*.
