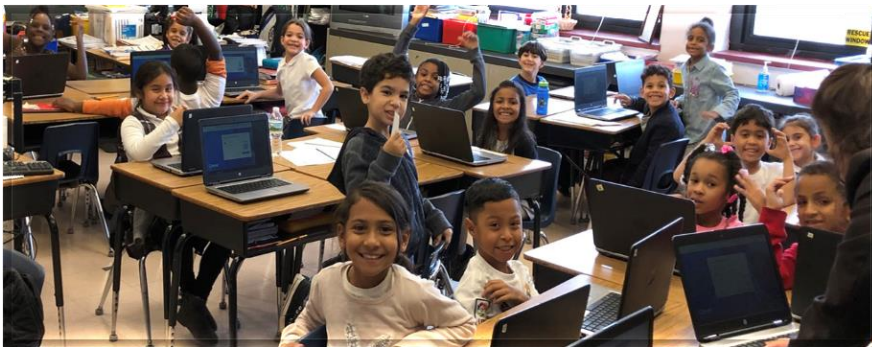

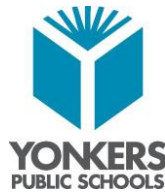

New York State Master Teacher Program

Purpose:

The purpose of the Master Teacher Program is to provide funds for Master Teacher Awards in order to attract highly qualified, experienced, expert teachers to teach in low-performing schools. **Only districts with a building designated as SURR or low performing (Priority or Focus) are eligible.** Teacher applicants for the award must be Nationally Board Certified and employed full-time in a low-performing public school. The initial **annual** award is \$10,000 and is renewable for two additional years. The maximum cumulative total of all awards is \$30,000. These funds are in addition to, and not a part of the teachers' base salary.

The teacher who agrees to participate in the Master Teacher Program agrees to teach within their school that has been designated by SED as a SUR or low performing school for 1-3 years. With their service to the school, the teacher will serve as a model classroom in facilitating intervisitations from colleagues, as well as collaborate with the Principal and lead professional learning workshops during standard faculty meetings. The first year of service will begin during the 2023-2024 academic year.

Eligible Applicants:

- Are Nationally Board Certified (determined by The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards) <http://www.nbpts.org/>
- Are employed full time at a SURR or low-performing public school
- Agree to serve up to three years (one year for each award) at the SURR or low-performing school in Yonkers Public Schools

Allowable Expenses:

These funds must be used to provide stipends awarded to Designated Master Teachers serving in SURR or low-performing schools.

Non-allowable Expenses:

Funds may **NOT** be used to pay fringe benefits or indirect or administrative costs on these awards.
