MYTHS OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

Myth

- If children are exposed to English and their native language at home, it leads to language disorders and delays.
- Students should be discouraged from using their native language in school.
- ELLs should be taught to read in English from the beginning.
- ► Teachers often have lower expectations for ELL students.

Fact

- It is very important that parents speak the language in which they are most fluent to their children. Acquiring two languages at an early age strengthens cognitive abilities. Being bilingual also gives students academic and economic advantages in our global economy.
- Schools encourage students to use their native language to support student learning.
- Reading skills transfer from one language to another. Students who first learn to read in their native language, will be more successful readers in English.
- ► Teachers maintain high expectations for all students. Educators build on ELLs' prior knowledge and find ways to facilitate higher-order thinking skills in their lessons. ENL teachers collaborate with classroom teachers to help ELLs acquire English academic skills and content at the same time.




- ► Cohort A: In school Mondays and Tuesdays

USING BENCHMARK IN ENL CLASS


- ► Benchmark is our new reading program
