Eleventh Grade Summer Reading Assignment 2019

This is the summer reading assignment for students entering eleventh grade at Yonkers Montessori Academy in September 2019. Please read the assignment, directions, and requirements carefully. Summer reading assignments will be collected **September 6th**, **2019**. There will be additional assignments and assessments based on the summer reading that will be given during the first making period that will count towards the first marking period grade.

Requirements:

- 1. You must read **Night** by Elie Wiesel.
- 2. While reading the text, you must fill in the required journal forms.
- 3. You are required to complete **ten journal forms** for the text. The pages in your copy of the book should be divided **equally into ten parts**. For instance, if your copy of the text is 280 pages, every 28 pages you will complete a journal entry. Similarly, if you are using an e-book, then you must take the total number of pages and divide them by ten, then complete a journal for each tenth of the book.
- 4. In the journal form, it will require you to include **parenthetical citations for quotes**. You must include citations for quotes. An example of a parenthetical citation is given below.
- 5. Your assignments must be complete. **Incomplete work will not be accepted**.
- 6. Your assignment is due **September 6th**, **2019**.

Directions:

- 1. Read Night by Elie Wiesel.
- 2. Complete a **journal entry** form for **every tenth** of the book you read. **A total of ten journal entries must be completed.**
- 3. Include **parenthetical citations** for quotes.
- 4. Hand in your journal entries on September 6th, 2019.
- 5. Be prepared to engage in other assignments and assessments in which you will use your knowledge of the text.

Parenthetical Citations: Parenthetical citations will follow the M.L.A. (Modern Language Association's) format for citing quotes and information from texts. When quoting, you will write the author's last name, followed by the page number in which the quoted material came from, and place it inside parenthesis.

Example: Elie asked Moche the Beadle, "Why are you so anxious that people should believe what you say. In your place, I shouldn't care whether they believed me or not..." (Wiesel 17)

The purpose of citations is to give credit to the writer and avoid plagiarism.
