# **Instructional Delivery**

# Elementary Schools (PK-5, PK-6, PK-8, YMA grades PK-8)

Students and parents should access instructional materials according to the plan communicated by the classroom teacher where applicable. Teachers may elect to communicate with students and parents using DoJo, Remind, or e-mail (parents only). The first source of instructional materials during this extended closure of schools are those developed by the classroom teacher(s). Students and parents should consult school webpages, teacher webpages, or letters sent home by the school. The second source of instructional materials during this extended closure of schools is the Electronic Learning channel. This channel can be accessed at www.yonkerspublicschools.org.

Students and parents must log the amount of time and activities completed each day. The district form for logging both the time spent on each activity as well as the activity can be found in the Electronic Learning channel under the heading Keeping Track of My Learning.

The log also provides opportunities for students to keep track of additional self-directed learning activities. It is essential that our students continue to learn in order to prevent the loss of learned skills. The best remedy to avoid loss of learned skills or to continue to grow is to prevent it from happening. Examples of self-directed learning activities include and are not limited to independent reading using hardcopy or digital resources such as Benchmark Universe and HMH Ed, Sumdog, Typing.com, journaling, physical activity, or creative arts.

Students and parents should consult school webpages, teacher webpages, or letters sent home by the school. The second source of instructional materials during this extended closure of schools is the Electronic Learning channel. Students attending a 6-12, 7-12, or 9-12 school will follow the suggested schedule provided by their teachers where applicable.
