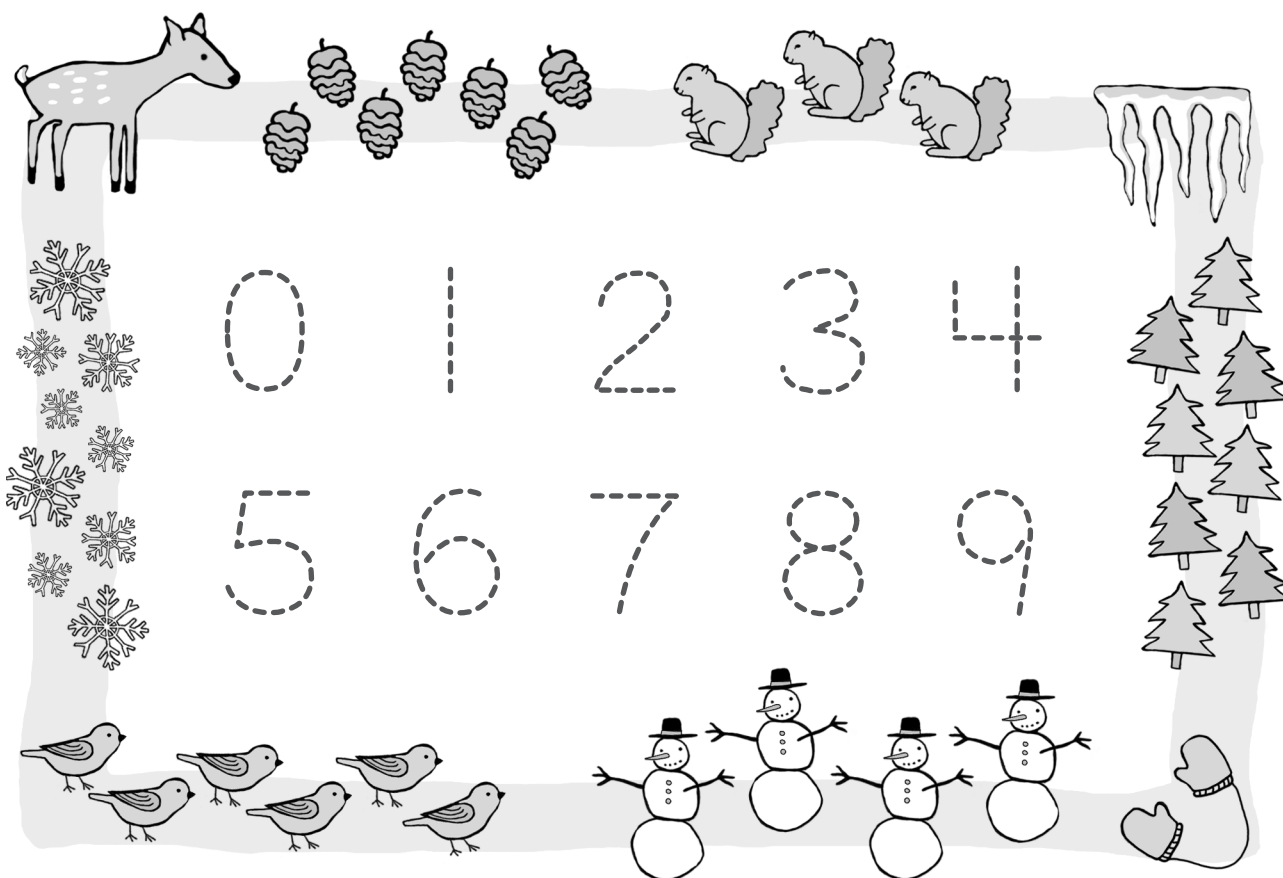

## Writing Numerals

#### Writing Numerals

An important step in developing math skills is the ability to write numerals. Use this page to help your child practice writing numbers up to nine. While tracing, ask your child to identify the numbers. Ask questions such as: *What number comes next? What number is after nine?* Be sure to help children form numerals using strokes that are top to bottom, left to right. You might want to cover this sheet with clear self-stick paper to make a slate that can be used over and over again (just use black crayon and erase with a paper towel). Look around your house for other numbers. Help your child write them. Then, help your child count the groups of winter objects on the page. *How many snowmen are there? How many icicles?*

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
