

SUMMER SESSION ELIGIBILITY

The Secondary Distance Learning Summer School Academy is restricted to those students in grades 7-12 who have failed a course during the academic year and who were in good attendance in that class. Specifically, according to the District's Attendance Policy, a student may not have been absent more than 24 times for a full credit course or more than 12 times for a half (1/2) credit course.

GUIDELINES FOR COURSES AND CREDIT

- All Courses will be taught live on Microsoft Teams. Students need to log on, participate and make sure that their attendance is recorded.
- All courses are to be considered make-ups. They are not intended for acceleration or enrichment.
- Credits will be granted by the home school principal upon successful completion of each course. This policy also applies to students who take courses in any New York State approved out-of-district Summer Session program.
- Enrollment will be on a first-come, first-served basis according to the registration schedule. However, priority will be given to 8th and 12th graders. When maximum class enrollment (30 students) is achieved, courses will be closed. Courses with enrollments of fewer than 15 students may be closed.
- All courses offered will be subject to District pupil/teacher ratio levels.
- Students may not take more than two courses with the exception of 8th graders and 12th graders. In such cases, special permission is required from their home school principal in writing.

REGISTRATION

Registration will be completed by the students' home school. Each school will submit a list of students who are eligible for the program.

ATTENDANCE

There will be thirty-one (31) days of instruction for all students enrolled in the Yonkers Summer Session. Instruction begins on June 29 and ends on August 11. Students with absences in a course exceeding two (2) instructional school days may not be permitted to receive any credit unless authorized by the Yonkers Summer Session Principal.

Parents/Guardians are requested to call the school between 8:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. on the day a student will be absent at (914) 376-8400. A note must accompany the student on their return to class.
