STARTING THE COLLEGE PLANNING PROCESS FOR PARENTS OF JUNIORS

Parents, as we navigate the journey through high school with your children, we believe it is crucial to begin discussing the college planning process. While college may seem distant, early preparation can greatly benefit your child's future. We would like to outline what both you and your students can do to prepare for this important step in their educational journey.

- 1. **Start Conversations**: Initiate open and honest discussions with your child about their aspirations and interests. Ask them about their goals and what they envision for their future.
- 2. **Explore College Options:** Begin researching colleges and universities together. Discuss the different types of institutions, majors, and locations. Encourage your child to attend college fairs and explore online resources.
- 3. **Financial Planning**: College can be expensive, so it's essential to start thinking about finances early. Research financial aid options, scholarships, and savings plans. Consider consulting with a financial advisor to create a plan.
