In preparation for the 2022-2023 school year, your child is encouraged to use our new online portal called **Clever** to continue his/her learning outside the classroom.





Book Projects: Choose ONE!

Accordion Book: The student will need paper, cardboard, fabric or wallpaper, and a ribbon. The title of the book, author, and illustrator (if there is one) goes on the front cover. The student's name goes on the back cover. The student will write in ink or maker (no pencil) or type the information. The six panels will depict six scenes from the story in order. There should be a short explanation of each scene to go with each illustration. Each illustration should be in color and neat. The student must write in complete sentences and use correct grammar, punctuation, and spelling.

<u>Cereal Box:</u> The student will need to cover an empty cereal box with white paper. On the top panel the following information is required: book title, author and illustrator (if there is one). On the bottom panel, the student should write his or her name. On the front of the box, draw a scene from the book that describes the story. On the side panel, write a paragraph describing the scene on the front. On the other side panel, write a paragraph describing the main character(s). On the back of the box, draw all the main character(s). Make sure all the illustrations are in color; use colored pencils, crayons, or markers.
