



Target grammar by asking the students to use complete sentences to identify where the balloons are.


For a challenge, identify the opposite spatial concepts or synonyms (i.e. above = over)

Print on cardstock & laminate, or just use plain paper ©

















































Follow spatial directions (1 and 2 step) for where to place the balloons

Print the balloons on card stock or other thick paper and laminate. Use velcro to secure the balloons when following the directions.



Follow the directions to find out where to stick the balloons

Put the orange balloon under the girl with the party horn

Put the pink balloon next to / beside the white cake with blue frosting

Put the turquoise balloon above the bear with the presents

Put the purple balloon in front of the boy with the big birthday cake

Put the green balloon beneath the dog in the party hat

Put the light blue balloon on the dog with the green balloon

Put the yellow balloon between the orange party hat and the boy with

confetti

Put the brown balloon behind the dinosaur

Put the grey balloon above the dinosaur

Put the black balloon under the girl holding a piece of cake
